This small but diverse remnant prairie came under the management of Marshall County Conservation Board in 2006. Like many of



the recreational areas in our county, Wehrmann Prairie has a rich historical background.

Originally the land was given through the Land Grant Act to the widow of David Sanford who was captain in the U.S. infantry and was killed in the War of 1812. She then sold the land to Henry Wehrmann who came

to the area to farmstead.

This areas was once the location the Logan Number 7 Rural School



House. The prairie area was an important part of the Wehrmann family and was maintained over the years. Now if one was to walk through the prairie you would find: Bird's Foot Violet, Puccoon, Yellow Star Grass, Wild Indigo, Lead Plant, Rattlesnake



Master, Turk's Cap Lily, New Jersey Tea, and too many more to mention.
