

Outdoor recreation opportunities are important to the overall quality of life in the Marshalltown area.



The Marshall County Conservation Board purchased the 95-acre Sand Lake area in 1999 with the

assistance of the Iowa Natural Heritage Foundation. Approximately \$46,000 was donated by more than 220 individuals, businesses, and organizations to allow for the purchase and initial development projects.

SAND LAKE has easy access from East Main Street. Additional water may be available after the sand and gravel business completes use of adjacent lands. This could take 10 – 15 years.

Private land surrounds Sand Lake. Boundary signs are in place to make the public aware of the property lines. Respect private property. Do not trespass.

Authorized PUBLIC USES for Sand Lake, set by policy of the MCCB, include:

FISHING: Walk-in access

State fishing regulations apply

HIKING, WILDLIFE VIEWING

WILDLIFE REFUGE: no hunting,
no firearms

No camping: Motor vehicles restricted to parking lots and boat ramp

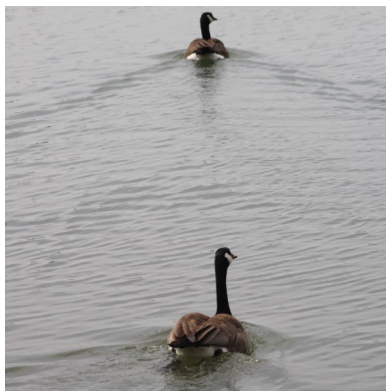
Pets must be leashed at all times

BOATS: Electric powered only and/or

Rowboats, canoes, paddleboats

NO SWIMMING

Sand Lake is an important stopover and wintering area for wildlife. Giant Canada geese and other migrating waterfowl use the site to rest and feed. Bald Eagles are frequently seen near the area.



Bass, bluegill, crappie, and walleye pike exist in the ponds. Other river species include white bass, yellow bass, green sunfish, carp, big mouth buffalo, yellow perch, and quillback carpsucker. State DNR fisheries personnel assist the MCCB and make recommendations for underwater structures to enhance fish habitat.
