Permit Rules and Regulations

General Permits

(ex.: cutting firewood, scouting, dog training, etc.)

- A government-issued form of identification is required to obtain a permit.
- General permits will be issued free of charge.
- General permits will be issued for one (1) week beginning on Saturday and ending on the following Friday, with a maximum of two consecutive permits allowed.
- Permits will issued not more than 30 days prior to the permit period.
- All permits are **non-transferable**, and must be obtained **in-person** at the Conservation Department Offices during regular business hours.
- Under no conditions may a permit holder monetarily gain from the harvested resources of the area specified in the permit.
- No motorized vehicles will be permitted outside the designated parking area.

$\frac{\textbf{GENERAL PERMITS FOR KETCHUM SWITCH RECREATION}}{\textbf{AREA}}$

- General permits will be issued free of charge. General permits will **ONLY** be available from March 1 to March 31 and June 1 to September 1 of each year.
- Permits will issued not more than 30 days prior to the permit period.
- General permits will be issued for one (1) week beginning on Saturday and ending on the following Friday, with a maximum of two consecutive permits allowed.
- All permits are **non-transferable**, and must be obtained **in-person** at the Conservation Department Offices during regular business hours.
- **Dogs**-<u>In accordance with IAC 571, Chapter 51.5 nesting seasons</u>, dogs will only be permitted on KSRA from February 1 to March 15, and July 15 to September 1 of each year.
- **Equestrian** the use of horses or any equestrian activity is strictly prohibited within this area.

It is strictly prohibited for any person(s) to disturb, desecrate, and/or remove any cultural and/or geological resource, *pursuant to Iowa Code Chapters*716, 523I, 263B and Iowa Administrative Code 685-11, from the Ketchum Switch Recreation Area. Any person(s) found in violation will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of all state and federal statutes.

The Henry County Conservation Board and the Henry County Conservation Department reserves the right to deny access to Ketchum Switch Recreation Area to any and all person(s).
