Tasha West, Trail Technician II at Gypsum City Off-Highway Vehicle Park attended the National Off-Highway Vehicle Conservation Council (NOHVCC) Conference in Miday, Utah October 12-14, 2023. NOHVCC holds an annual conference, which brings land managers, agency staff and OHV enthusiasts together from all over the country to network, learn and continue creating a positive future for off-highway vehicle recreation.

Annually the staff at NOHVCC present awards to volunteers and land managers that contribute time, effort and commitment to furthering responsible OHV recreation across the country. This year, West was awarded with "Partner of the Year." State Partners serve as liaisons between NOHVCC and motorized recreation enthusiasts in their states. West has been a State Partner with NOHVCC since 2015.

MOTUS BIRD ANTENNA: \$4.000

The Motus Wildlife Tracking System is an international collaborative network that uses automated radio telemetry to simultaneously track hundreds of individuals of numerous species of birds, bats, and insects. The system enables a community of researchers, educators, organizations, and citizens to undertake impactful research and education on the ecology and



SWAN TAXIDERMY: \$1,600 (X2)

Two Trumpeter Swans will be flying above the exhibit space showing the relationship between water and it's fowl. Both swans were recovered after being lead poisoned from decades old lead that they retrieved off the bottoms of shallow ponds and lakes where they fed. With this knowledge there are additional lessons of ethical use of our environment and impacts



PEDESTAL BINOCULAR VIEWERS: \$4,000 (X2)

These binocular viewers will be a great addition to the west deck of the Discovery Center where you look out to the river, Duck Island, and the Western bluff and greenbelt of Fort Dodge. This feature will allow for all types of wildlife viewing as well as an up close glimpse of the bird feeder trail.
